Paid Union Meeting

Dear Parents/Whanau of Marlborough Schools

School Funding and Decile System Under Review - You will no doubt have read or heard recently about this funding review.

As a result of this the teacher unions has planned (unprecedented) combined Paid Union Meetings for NZEI and PPTA members across the country. These, we are sorry to say, are taking place in school time which is going to cause some disruption. For Marlborough, our combined meeting is scheduled for 9am, Tuesday 13th September at Marlborough Boys College. Please note this decision was made by national office and we, principals and teachers, are disappointed that we are unable to change this time. (We are not in the habit of disrupting our students learning)

What is all the fuss about?

This is a serious matter as the outcome of this review will have far reaching implications for every school and early childhood centre in the country and therefore your children.

There are several issues at play and it is important to understand how these might impact on the long term operation of schools. One of the options under consideration

that has given rise to the debate and brought urgency to the consultation is below;

Global Funding - where schools are fully funded for their teacher salaries and operations. This would mean that schools would have total control (as they do now) on how they allocate available funding - but with the addition of making decisions on the number of teachers that would be funded and employed. There may well be some flexibilities here, but there are also some significant fish hooks that could have a negative impact on students opportunities within school and therefore achievement outcomes. This Paid Union Meeting is to seek clarification, and advocate for our students and our schools funding future.




QCC Musical Production
